**Crowne Plaza Hotel:** cnr Arden & Carr Streets Coogee (***this is where the dinner on the Monday evening will be held***)

20 minute walk to UNSW (hilly area), 10 minutes by bus or 5-10 taxi ride for around \$10  
Room rate with ocean view \$265 per night  
Room rate with Coogee village view \$215 per night

5 minute walk from the Crown Plaza Hotel
